**NOTICE OF ORDER OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE UNITED STATES
ON APPLICATION FOR STAY OF PRELIMINARY INJUNCTIONS**

Attached as Exhibit A is an Order from the Supreme Court of the United States adopted by a 5-4 vote, which stays nationwide preliminary injunctions issued by the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York against the Department of Homeland Security's Public Charge Rule. As noted by Justice Gorsuch in his opinion concurring with the Court's Order, the result of the stay is that the Public Charge Rule is now in effect "everywhere save Illinois," Ex. A, at 2, where the Rule remains subject to an injunction issued by the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, *Cook Cty v. McAleenan*, --- F. Supp. 3d ---, No. 19 C 6334, 2019 WL 5110267, at *14 (N.D. Ill. Oct. 14, 2019).

As this Court is aware, Defendants' Motion for Stay Pending Appeal, ECF No. 84, remains pending. In their Reply in Support of Motion for Stay Pending Appeal, ECF No. 92, Defendants stated that they "would not oppose revisiting the stay" of proceedings, should this Court grant one, "at such time as the Rule again stands to be enforced in Maryland," when Plaintiffs would, in Defendants' view, "have a more credible claim to prejudice from a stay," *id.*

at 7. As the Public Charge Rule is now in effect in Maryland and the other states where Plaintiff CASA de Maryland, Inc., operates, there is now, as Defendants recognize, even greater reason for the Court to proceed toward final resolution of this case. Plaintiffs therefore respectfully request that the Court deny Defendants' Motion to Stay Proceedings in light of the Supreme Court's Order.
