**UNOPPOSED MOTION TO EXTEND BRIEFING SCHEDULE**

On February 14, 2020, the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit issued its decision in the related case *Gresham v. Azar*, No. 19-5094 (D.C. Cir). In addition, the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services has intervened in this case, *see* Minute Order (Feb. 20, 2020), and has represented to defendants that current Medicaid beneficiaries in Michigan would not learn of any terminations in coverage as a result of non-compliance with the work and community engagement requirement until May 7, 2020, and would not lose any coverage until, at the earliest, June 1, 2020.

In light of the above developments, defendants respectfully request a one-week extension of all current deadlines. Counsel for plaintiffs state that they consent to the extension, and counsel for intervenor Michigan Department of Health and Human Services state that they do not oppose the extension.

If the instant motion is granted, the briefing schedule shall proceed as follows:

- March 3, 2020**           Federal defendants shall file their opening brief
- March 24, 2020**       Plaintiffs shall file any response
- April 7, 2020**         Federal defendants shall file any reply
