STAY ORDER

On December 22, 2020, the parties in the above-captioned matter filed a joint status report requesting that the Court continue the stay of proceedings until 30 days after either (1) the time for filing a petition for a writ of certiorari expires in *Community Health Choice, Inc. v. United States*, No. 19-1633, and *Maine Community Health Options v. United States*, No. 19-2102, or (2) if such a petition is filed, the United States Supreme Court determines whether to grant or deny certiorari (ECF No. 32). The parties state that the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit denied petitions for rehearing *en banc* in *Community Health Choice* and *Maine Community Health Options* on November 10, 2020. *Id.* at 1. The parties further state that pursuant to Rule 13.3 of the Rules of the Supreme Court of the United States and the Supreme Court’s March 19, 2020, Order extending the time for filing a petition for a writ of certiorari to 150 days, the deadline for the parties in those cases to file a petition for a writ of certiorari is April 9, 2021. *Id.* at 1-2. And so, the parties request that the Court continue the stay of proceedings and that they be permitted to file another joint status report within 30 days of either the expiration of the deadline to file a petition for a writ of certiorari in *Community Health Choice* and *Maine Community Health Options*, or if such a petition is filed, until the Supreme Court determines whether to grant or deny certiorari. *Id.* at 2.

In light of the foregoing, and for good cause shown, the Court continues the **STAY** of proceedings in this matter until **May 10, 2021**. The parties shall **FILE** a joint status report updating the Court on the status of *Community Health Choice* and *Maine Community Health Options*, and proposing further proceedings, on or before **May 10, 2021**.
