Dear Ms. Wolfe:

We submit this letter pursuant to the Court's order of February 5, 2021, which placed these consolidated appeals in abeyance and directed appellants to file stay status letters every 30 days, beginning 30 days from the date of the order. These consolidated appeals concern the validity of a final rule that the U.S. Department of Health & Human Services (HHS) promulgated in 2019. *See* Protecting Statutory Conscience Rights in Health Care, 84 Fed. Reg. 23,170 (May 21, 2019). HHS has now considered the issues and determined that it wishes to engage in notice-and-comment rulemaking to revisit the rule at issue in these appeals. Accordingly, HHS has drafted a notice of proposed rulemaking and submitted it to the Office of Information and Regulatory Affairs (OIRA) within the Office of Management and Budget for review and approval.¹ We will file additional status reports at 30-day intervals, consistent with the Court's order.
